## **News Updates**

Since the printing of our last newsletter we have a number of updates:

- Following liaison with DLRCoCo 'Children at Play' signs have been erected at the greens linking Watson Drive to Watson Park, and Watson Park to Brackenbush Road. The 'Cul-de-Sac' sign in Granville Close has also been replaced and a 'Children at Play' sign erected.
- We have written to all of the sports clubs based in Kilbogget Park regarding ongoing issues with parking at match times. We are co-working with them in their appeal to DLRCoCo for a bigger car park within the park to facilitate all cars - which will save our footpaths and roads.
- We have written to DLRCoCo with a list of all trees reported by you for removal / replanting.
   We are also in the process of requesting a number of large trees on verges within the estate are trimmed to clear footpaths and visibility.
- Neighbourhood Watch: thankfully we have had a quiet summer. Incidents of crime and suspicious activity are down. This is good news, and in line with local Gardaí reports.
- We made a submission to *Bus Connects* re: proposed bus changes on behalf of all residents.

## **Blocked Drain Database**

The Residents Association has decided to compile a database of residents who have suffered from blocked drains and had to pay for them to be cleared. This decision was made for two reasons. Firstly, in light of the recent planning permission and proposed building works behind Watson Road, and secondly, as a result of the numerous drainage issues many residents have faced over the years.

If you have had to pay a contractor to clear your drains we are asking you to let us know when they were cleaned and to give us a copy of the receipt if you have it. #### Wheelie Bins

Following on from the article in our Summer Newsletter about wheelie bin clips, we would like to remind all residents to be bin conscious this autumn and winter. Due to high winds and overflowing bins we have had an increase of litter throughout the estate recently.

We would be grateful if all residents could ensure their bins are not over filled and the lid is secure when you are putting your bin out. Also, the location of your bin is important. While we acknowledge the kerb is an ideal location for bins from a bin company point of view, kerbs are also exposed to high winds and are the easiest place for bins to be blown over. Placing your bin next to your hedge / garden wall is a more secure location and could assist with minimising litter at this time of year.
